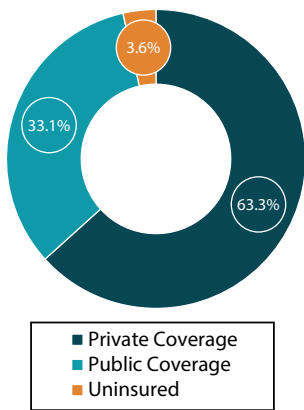

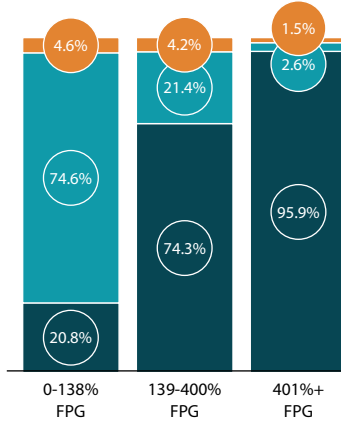

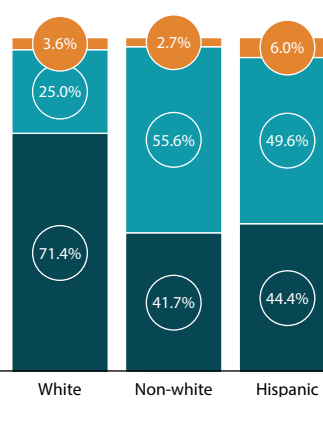

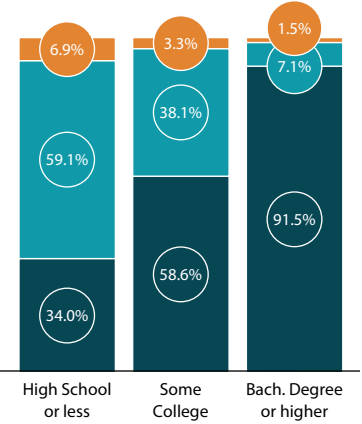
**BY INCOME**



**BY RACE/ETHNICITY**

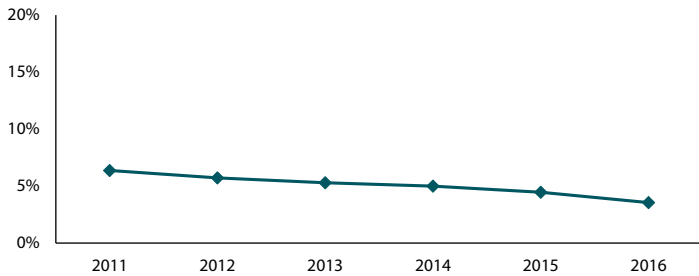

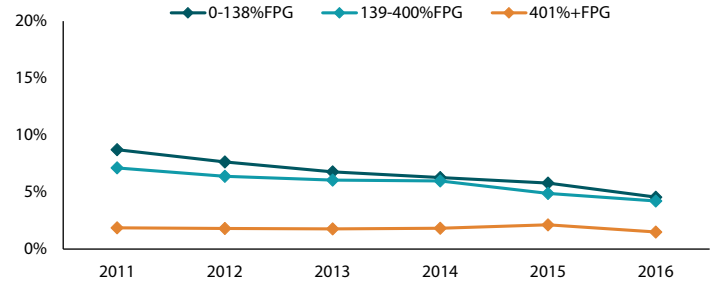

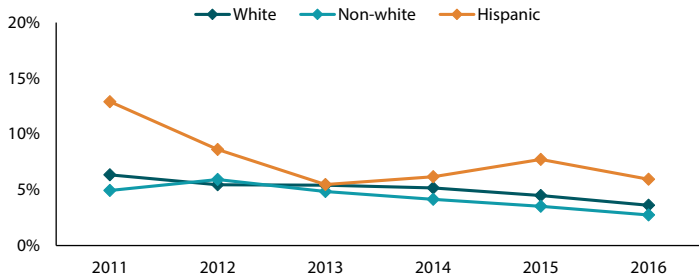
**UNINSURED, ALL CHILDREN**



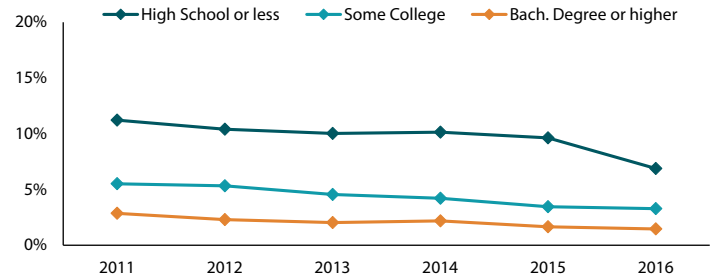
**UNINSURED CHILDREN BY INCOME**



**UNINSURED CHILDREN BY RACE/ETHNICITY**



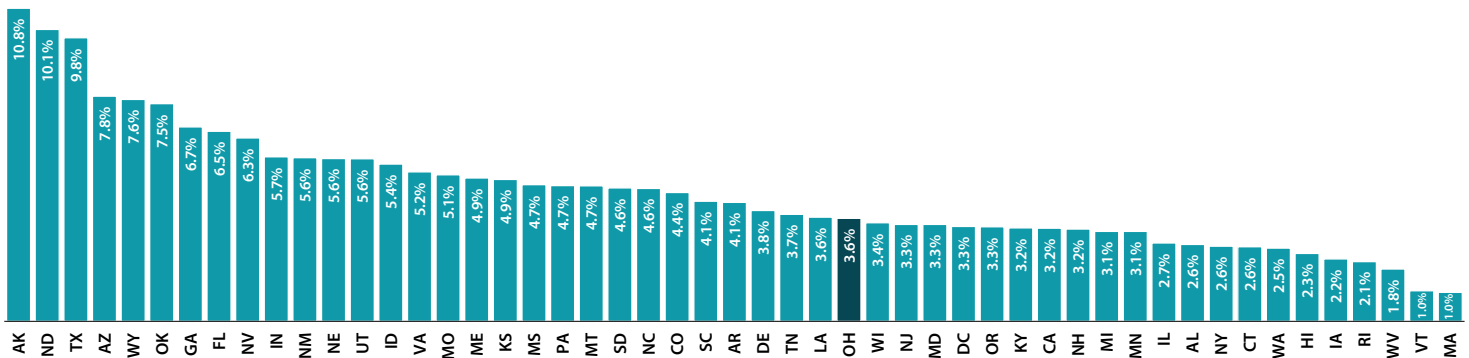
**UNINSURED CHILDREN BY HOUSEHOLD EDUCATION**
